This just about required to ensure you get maximum life from the tires and have a spare set. I like a 3rd set to let the car sit on old tires at home or have a set ready for rain use.

Still 2 sets are a minium. You can also run early offset phone dials on an 84. Some say they are heavier, but I don't know they really make any differents. Remember the later offset guys have to run phone dials as those are the only ones that fit their cars.
