I believe that we were actually heavy to the rule set. At 135 hp, I believe ptf would be legal for a spec 944 with a little additional weight. If your car dyno's at 125 (like mine used to!) you are legal at your 2600 lb weight. Because you are allowed 19 mod points in pt, and spec cars don't have many/mods to the calculator.... (tires, non stick sway bars) it's strictly power to weight, pte is 16.5 lb to hp. Ptf is 19.5. Per hp. In my opinion at this stage of the game is to get out there, have fun, find a group of good folks to run with.
